



What is Rtl?

- * Process to identify students struggling academically and/or behaviorally
- * Apply research-based strategies to help the student succeed
- * Data collection throughout Rtl allows a teacher to identify specific interventions that are successful for an individual student
- * Early intervention is a key for students to be successful throughout their academic career

What can I expect as the parent of an RTI student?

1. Every child will have in class support using flexible grouping
2. Parents will be involved in their child's intervention plan.
3. Data will be collected referencing their child's progress.

What is Response to Intervention?

Parents want their children to learn and do well in school. It can be very frustrating if your child falls behind in reading, math, writing, or other subjects. Schools are changing how to approach student learning. Response to intervention (RTI) is a process of educationally supporting students by increasing intervention intensity based upon their learning needs. The goal is to prevent problems and intervene early so that students can be successful.

What Do I Do if I Believe my Child is Struggling?

- Review and assist with homework
- Ask for regular progress monitoring reports or access Progress Book
- Participate in conferences and meeting.

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What do I need to do with Rtl now?

Review your Rtl roster of students for this year. School Psych and Counseling will touch base with you about questions regarding goals for your students.

As needed, fill out a green step form (online or in your building) to initiate Rtl (the team will support you with additional steps). Turn green step forms into your counselor once students need to progress to yellow.

Continue to collect data (grade level tests, OAA practice tests, observations, behavior tracking) for your at-risk students. The team will meet in September, January, and May to assist you with documenting your data on the Rtl roster.
