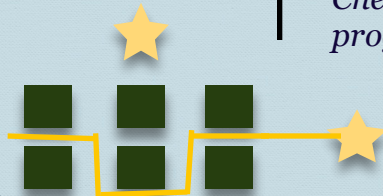


# Models of Co-Teaching

## One Teach, One Observe

\* Primary responsibility is to teach material

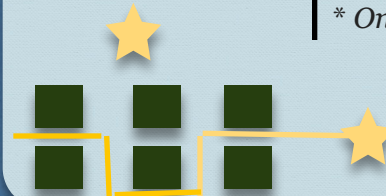
\* Use an observation checklist  
\* Check student progress



## One Teach, One Drift

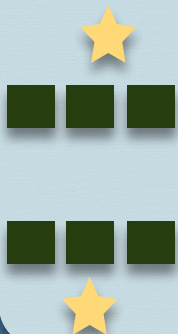
\* Primary responsibility is to teach material

\* Keep students focused  
\* Repeat instructions  
\* One-on-one help



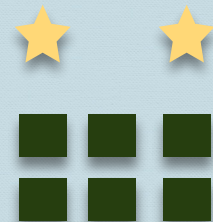
## Parallel Teaching

\* Class divided in half  
\* Teach same lesson at the same time  
\* Allows for increased student interaction  
\* Allows teachers to monitor student progress more



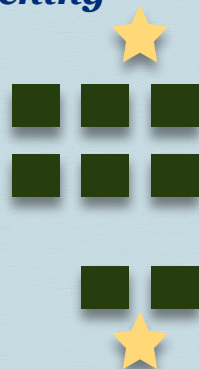
## Team Teaching

\* Two teachers with same content  
\* One teacher leads instruction  
\* One teacher models instruction  
\* An added bonus: quality personal interaction



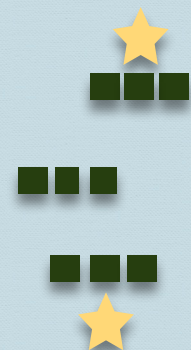
## Alternative Teaching

\* One teacher teaches the large group  
\* One teacher works with a small group



## Station Teaching

\* Content divided into different segments  
\* Students divided into small groups  
\* Third station is for independent work
